

Answers to FAQs regarding recitation competition

namaste,

Welcome to Samskritam Recitation Competition (Samskrta-kanthaphātha-spardhā) annually organized by Samskrita Bharati for last several years. One of the reasons for conducting a recitation competition is to introduce original Samskritam texts to children and their parents. We are happy that your children will be taking part in this event.

Bhartruhari, a Samskritam scholar of yore, composed "vaakyapadeeya" on Samskritam grammar – and Shataka Trishati, comprising 3 collections of 100 verses each. Of these 3 (shatakams), "neeti shatakam" is a popular text which explains moral conduct, and provides all of us especially our children an opportunity to learn and recite them. While a nominal translation of the stanzas is provided with the practice text for your quick reference, you are encouraged to research the detailed commentary on this treatise – published by India's Raashtriya Samskrita Samsthaanam.

1) How can I get the competition date, time and venue information? We are planning to hold this competition in various cities across the US. DFW center's competition is to be held on 5th December, 2015 at DFW Hindu Temple, 1605 N. Britain Road, Irving, TX 75061, between 1:00 and 4:30 pm. It will be interspersed with Vishwa Samskrita Dinam celebrations that have variety entertainment programs in simple samskritam by Samskrita Bharati students of DFW Metroplex.

2) What is the text selected for the Recitation Competition?

For prior years, we had selected sūtras (aphorisms) from the samādhiH and sādhana pāda of Maharshi Patanjali's Yogasutra, a popular yoga text which succinctly summarizes the science of Yoga in sūtra-form. For this year's competition, our children will have an opportunity to memorize and chant from the Bharturhari subhāshitāni from nītiṣatakam. We are confident that our children will be able to memorize these subhāshitāni given proper guidance and practice time. For proper pronunciation and meter, please refer to the website audio link.

3) What are the categories that children can compete in? How many subhāshitāni should they memorize for the competition?

There are five categories based on grade level. The number of subhāshitāni to be memorized depends on each category as follows:

atiśiśugaṇaH (Preschool min. 3 yrs) → subhāshitāni 1, 2, 14 (=part 1), subhāshitāni 7, 12, 13 (=part 2)
śiśugaṇaH (KG & 1st grade) → part 1, subhāshitam 24, part 2, subhāshitāni 17, 18, 23 (=part 3)
bālagaṇaH (children 2nd - 4th grades) → part1, subhāshitam 24, part2, part3, subhāshitāni 6, 11, 19, 20, 22
kiśōragaṇaH (5-7 grade) → part1, subhāshitam 24, part2, subhāshitāni 6, 11, 15, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22, 25
yuvagaṇaH (8th grade and above) → subhāshitāni 1 to 25 in straight sequence

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4) Would you permit my child to compete in a lower or a higher category? Can my child compete in two categories?

Sorry. We want all children to participate only in their respective grade-level category. Only one entry per child is allowed in the entire competition.

5) My child knows many ślokas. Can s/he recite these other ślokas?

Glad to know (!). For this competition however, your child should know and recite the subhāshitāni from the nītiṣatakam of vidvān Bharturhari that we have selected for the child's grade-level. Please see answer to Q3.

6) Should a child memorize all the subhāshitāni?

Children are expected to memorize and recite all the subhāshitāni in their category (please see answer to Q3 above). Our focus is on participation and recitation; competition is just a means to inspire children about learning original Samskritam texts. Therefore, we encourage all children who have registered to participate even if they have not memorized all the subhāshitāni in their category. 7) What are the prizes?

All children will get a participation certificate. Top contenders in each of the five categories will be given prizes.

8) When will the certificates and the prizes be distributed?

Participation certificates and prizes will be given on the same day at the conclusion of the competition.

9) Is there any fee for participation?

There will be a nominal registration fee of \$10.00(ten USD) per child. Payment can be made thru paypal during registration. Please see registration link for details.

10) How will the participants be judged?

Judging will be based on the following four criteria:

- a) Memory (ability to recite without break, hesitation or confusion)
- b) Pronunciation and clarity
 - i. Diction (crisp and correct pronunciation)
 - ii. Tone and flow (proper meter to be used)
- c) Presentation (posture, mannerism and sincerity of effort)
- d) Overall effect (right attitude and feeling of the participant and its effect on the listener).

11) How will I know the time when my child will be required to recite on competition day?

As in the past, many children (50 to 100 in any given center) are expected to participate in this year's competition. Therefore, it is difficult to state exactly when your child's turn will come on the day of the competition. We understand that you and your child(ren) may have other commitments but once registered, we hope that you would make attending recitation competition a priority on the day of competition.

12) Once registered, can a registrant drop out?

Lot of volunteer time and effort goes into planning and putting together such quality programs. We hope that registrants also value and appreciate the effort of the volunteers. We request that you inform us at the earliest if you are unable to attend due to any reason, by sending an email to dallas@samskritabharatiusa.org. It would help us plan the event better since no-shows hurt any competition. There is no refund on the cancellations.

Samskritam Classes
